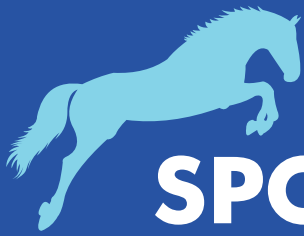

HORSE HEALTH INFORMATION

IMPORTANT EQUINE HEALTH INFORMATION

We strongly recommend all horses stabling on the Colorado Horse Park Grounds arrive between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. If it is necessary to arrive at any other time **you must make arrangements prior to arrival.**

All paperwork must be in the horse's show name.

LEG Shows and Events Management strives to provide an excellent showing environment. An integral part of an excellent showing environment includes healthy horses. Exhibitors, especially those traveling long distances, can contribute to that healthy environment by adhering to the following requirements for entry to the facility and recommendations for safe practices.

1. A current negative Coggins test is required for all horses entering the facility. Please renew before it expires, and not just before it is necessary to leave the state.
2. **Statement of Health/Veterinary Health Certificate** signed by a licensed veterinarian **within 30 days of arrival** at CHP, documenting that the horse has:
 - A. Received regular and consistent vaccination against Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 with the most recent booster being within 180 days. Written Statements from the Vet explaining reasons for being bolstered within 180 Days MAY be accepted. IN NO CASES MAY THE BOOSTER BE OUTSIDE OF 180 DAYS. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be denied entry to the competition grounds upon request by Management.
 - B. Not shown symptoms of or been treated for EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days.
 - C. Not been at a facility under quarantine for EHV-4/1 or exposed to any horses showing symptoms of EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days.
3. Current vaccination against WNV, EEE, WEE, Tetanus, Rabies are strongly recommended.
4. You should be able to document your horse's normal temperature before arrival. Please do not ship horses with elevated temperatures. It is highly recommended that prior to arrival you establish a log of temperatures taken at least twice daily. While on the show grounds temperatures should be taken twice daily (am and pm) and logged. Competition Stewards will be spot checking temperature logs of all horses, please make sure each horse's temperature log is readily available. Any horse on the show grounds with a temperature over 101.5 F must be reported immediately to LEG Management and the Official Show Veterinarian. It is always better to err on the side of safety. Isolation stalls are available on the grounds and if necessary at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.
5. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses shipped long distances. Extra horses on a horse van, or moving from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horse's and your neighbor's horse's health.
6. Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices and impress its importance to your groom in everyday care.

HUNTER SCHOOLING: Ticketed Schooling may be held in the designated hunter rings the day prior to the start of the show. At managements and course designer's discretion, rings may be open for schooling at the completion of the show day. Weather permitting, hunter rings will be open until 7:00am each show day for hacking only. Poling and offsets are not allowed at any time at the Colorado Horse Park (GR843).

HANDY CLASSES: In all 'A' rated hunter sections (except Green Pony Hunter) the second over fence class will be a handy round.

ORDER OF GO: Classes in the Hunter Rings will have posted start times that will be adhered to as closely as possible. Posted orders may be imposed at any time. All class entries must be made by 4:00pm the day prior to each class. Trainer conflicts are not considered a valid reason for holding a class.

JOG FOR SOUNDNESS: Soundness to be determined using OPTION A – TROT CIRCLE (HU118.3)– Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. The following sections will not be required to jog for soundness: Young Hunters, Children's and Adult Hunters, Low Child and Low Adult Hunters, Pre-Child and Pre-Adult Hunters, Children's Pony Hunters, USHJA Hunters. Additionally, non-rated hunter sections will not be required to jog.

AWARDS/CHAMPION & RESERVE: Unless otherwise noted, a trophy will be awarded to first and ribbons through 8th. Prize money will be divided: 30%,22%,15%,12%, 11%, 10% Three must compete for points to count in all USEF rated classes. A minimum of two Over Fences and one Under Saddle Class must be held for a division to be considered complete. Champion and Reserve to two of the four horses acquiring the most points over fences in each section. In addition to these points, only these four horses, receive full points for Under Saddle classes. Points are awarded as follows:10,6,4,2,1, ½ . Model points to count ½ .

COMBINING AND SPLITTING (HU159 and HU166): In all 'A' rated hunter sections – Should entries warrant, all 'A' rated hunter sections will be split or combined following USEF rules and will be done at the close of the horse show office on the day preceding the first class in each section. Any post entries (adds) accepted after this time will not be considered in respect to the splitting/combining numbers. Same day scratches and 'no-shows' in all 'A' rated sections will forfeit their entry fee unless a vet scratch issued by the Official Show Veterinarian is received by the show secretary prior to the start of the section. When splitting all hunter classes, the preferred method will be "California Split" per HU162.

JUDGING CRITERIA: Hunters to be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

CONFORMATION HUNTERS: To be judged 70% on performance and 30% on conformation.

PONY HUNTERS: The first class in each 'A' rated section will be judged 25% on conformation.

GREEN HUNTERS 3' and 3'3", 3'6" and 3'9" See HU 131 for complete eligibility and cross entry restrictions.

AMATEUR OWNER HUNTERS: Riders may cross enter between the 3'6" Amateur Owner and/or the 3'3" Amateur Owner sections. Horses may not cross enter between the sections(HU137.5). Leased horses are not eligible and multiple ownership is not permitted unless all owners are members of the same family (HU137.1).

JUNIOR HUNTERS: Junior Hunter 3'3". Open to junior riders. Riders may not cross enter into any class at 3'6" or higher in the hunter division, higher than 3'9" in the equitation division or higher than 1.25m in the jumper division at the same competition. Horses entered in the Junior Hunter 3'3" section may not cross enter into Junior Hunter 3'6" sections at the same competition. (HU 143)

CHILDREN'S HUNTERS: Fences not to exceed 3'. Riders may not cross enter into any hunter class with fences exceeding 3'6" or any jumper class with fences exceeding 1.20M (3'11") at the same show. Horses may cross enter into any other classes or sections where eligible. The horse/rider combination is restricted from showing in the both the Junior Hunter and Children's Hunter at the same show. The horse/rider combination may not enter into a USHJA International Hunter Derby.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTERS: Fences not to exceed 3'. Riders may not cross enter into any hunter class with fences exceeding 3'6" or any jumper class with fences exceeding 1.20M (3'11") at the same show. Horses may cross enter into any other classes or sections where eligible. The horse/rider combination is restricted from showing in the both the Amateur Owner and Adult Amateur at the same show. The horse/rider combination may not enter into a USHJA International Hunter Derby.

PRE-CHILDREN'S AND PRE-ADULT AMATEUR HUNTERS: Fences 2'6"-2'9" - The same horse / rider combination is restricted from showing in both Pre-Adult and Adult Amateur or Pre-Child and Children's Sections at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any section or class exceeding 3' at the same show.

LOW CHILD AND LOW ADULT HUNTERS: Fences 2'6" - Riders may not cross enter into any class where fences exceed 3'6" or 1.10M at the same show. Horse/Rider combinations may not cross enter into any class where fences exceed 2'9" at the same show (exception: 3' Equitation)

SHORT (11 & UNDER), LONG (12-17) AND RUSTY (18 & OVER) STIRRUP SECTIONS: Fences not to exceed 2'3", no in and outs, no oxers. Riders may not cross enter into any section or class exceeding 2'6" or any rated section or class at the same show with exception of USHJA 2' and USHJA 2'3" Hunters, age group, maiden, novice, limit equitation or flat classes.

The following classes are designed for entry level riders and have been developed to create an educational ladder for the beginning competitor. All classes will be judged on control of mount, appropriate pace, steering and effective position. Riders may cross enter between Walk-Trot and Walk-Trot-Canter. Riders may not compete in any class over fences at the same show other than these crossrail classes.

USEF and USHJA membership is not required to participate in Opportunity classes. Riders entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a Show Pass Fee. **Riders cross entering into any other class at the same show (including any warm-up classes) must pay membership or Show Pass fees.**

Horses entered only in these Opportunity classes are exempt from the Federation Fee, including the Drugs and Medication fee and are not required to have a Recording number. **Horses are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing.** There will be no in and outs or oxers in any Opportunity Class.

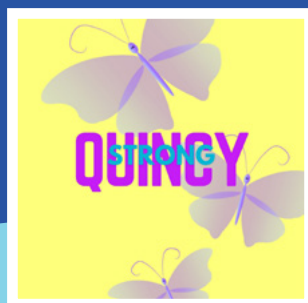

HUNTER CLASSICS AND SPECIAL HUNTER CLASSES SPECIFICATIONS

Eligibility: To be eligible for all Classics and Special Hunter Classes (USHJA National and International Hunter Derbies are exempt), a horse must have been shown and completed the course in at least two other classes in their respective division and must be declared for the class prior to the start of the first round of the Classic or Special class. Adds and Scratches will not be permitted after the first round class has begun.

Format and Scoring: Unless otherwise noted, the fourth over fences class (second class of the second day) in each respective section is designated as the first round of the respective Classic or Special Class, **or in the case of the USHJA Incentive, they will be run concurrently.** A minimum of 12 horses will return for the second round, horses must receive a score in the first round to return for round two. The order of go for round two will be low score to high score with the lowest score returning first. The winner will be decided by adding the scores from both rounds together. In the case of ties the **high score from round two** will determine the winner.

Order of Go: For all classics and special classes horses must be declared by 4:00pm pm the day preceding the class. The order will be drawn and posted shortly thereafter. All horses declared after 4:00pm will be considered post entries and may be required to go first in the order. **A scratch fee of \$50 will be applied for Classics or Special classes scratched the day the class is being held,** with the exception of vet scratches verified by the official show veterinarian.

Combining: If there are fewer than six (6) entries in any one Hunter Classic it will be combined with other sections of the same rating, regardless of the combining rules of the section.

Splitting: In the Junior, Amateur, Green pony and Regular pony sections, if there are 6 or more declared entries in each of the height sections the classic will be split.

Attire and Awards: Formal attire required. Unless otherwise noted, special award to first and ribbons through 10th. Prize money will be divided: 30%,22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.

ELIGIBILITY: Horses must be enrolled in the International Hunter Derby Program for 2025. **Exception: exhibitors may show in a maximum of one class in the series year without enrollment.** Riders, Owners and Trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA before the start of the class. Horses must be recorded with the Federation and registered with USHJA. Exception: The same horse may not compete in the USHJA International Hunter Derby and the National Hunter Derby at the same competition. Horses entered in this class are not required to show in any other hunter or jumper classes at the horse show. Riders are limited to competing no more than four (4) horses in each class. The same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the International Hunter Derby.

RIDERS MEETING: A Riders meeting will be held prior to the start of the class. Copies of the course will be available at the meeting. **There will be no hand walking for the Derby classes.**

SOUNDNESS: Horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the Classic Round. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the responsibility to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound.

STABLING/SCHOOLING: Schooling is permitted only in the designated schooling area and horses must wear their numbers at all times while the class is in progress. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited. **All horses must be on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the first round,** and must remain on the grounds until the horse has finished competing in the Derby.

SCORING: To be judged by two panels of one or two judges per panel seated separately. The total scores of each horse/rider combination from each round will be added together to determine the Overall standings for the class. The top 12 entries from round one will return for the handy round.

TIES: Ties in the first round will remain tied. The top 12 horses after the first round, including ties, will return for round two. All ties for overall first place may compete in a Jump Off Round at the discretion of the owners and riders. If a tie occurs after the Jump Off Round, or if both exhibitors agree not to jump off, the exhibitors will be named co-winners and will evenly split the prize money. JUMPER NOMINATING FEE: All horses entered in classes at 1.20m and above that pay prize money must pay the nominating fee of \$150. Once a horse is nominated they are entitled to compete in any jumper class for which they are eligible, providing they are entered and have paid the showing fee for each class. **Horses entered only in Young Jumper classes are exempt from paying the nominating fee.**

JUMPER TABLES: Refer to time schedule. Management reserves the right to change tables in all classes with adequate notice to competitors.

TIME ALLOWED: Speed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute for all rated jumpers (325mm for 5 year olds).

TIES: Ties for first will be jumped off and ties for other than first will be decided by the faults and time taken in the first round.

JUMPER HEIGHTS: Within each height, at least 60% of the jumps will be set at the maximum height specified. Any full width square oxer may be set 5 cm (2") lower than the height indicated.

TACK AND ATTIRE: Per JP111

MARTINGALES: Classes offered at 1.30m or below—No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Classes offered above 1.30m (and all classes restricted to young horses) the only martingales permitted are running martingales used in the conventional manner. Exception: Irish martingales are permitted in all classes. Only one martingale stopper per rein is allowed.

WHIPS: Competitors are prohibited from using a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while in the process of jumping or schooling over fences. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited at any time.

DRAW REINS/GERMAN MARTINGALES: Draw reins and German Martingales may not be used in any competition/class restricted to Ponies, Juniors and/or Amateurs, or by age of horse. Draw reins and German martingales may only be used when schooling or in classes with no prize money that are offered at 1.20m or below. Draw reins and/or German martingales may not be used on Ponies at any time when ridden by a junior. No other head set devices (chambon, etc.) are permitted in any class.

HOODED BLINKERS, SUNGLASSES, FLY MASKS, GOGGLES etc. that cover the horse's eyes are only allowed with a veterinary certificate stating the necessity. Blinkers or cheek pieces attached to the bridle may not exceed 5cm (2").

BOOTS: Young Jumpers – see JP117.2; ALL OTHERS: The total maximum weight of equipment allowed to be added to a horse's leg, front or hind (single or multiple boots, fetlock rings, etc.) is 500 grams or 17.637 ounces (shoe excluded). Failure to comply will incur disqualification. Boot Rules for USEF Ranking List classes see JP111.5.b

ATTIRE FOR ALL CLASSICS AND SPECIAL CLASSES: Proper Jumper Attire is required. Coats of any color are required. Breeches must be light color (white, fawn or canary). Pastel and dark colored breeches are not allowed. Shirts, light in color, must be tucked into breeches and fastened at the top of the neck. Ties or chokers of any color must be worn (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use). Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

FOR ALL OTHER JUMPER CLASSES: Standard Jumper Attire. Coats are not required. Breeches of any color are permitted. Shirts (polo shirts are permitted) must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short), and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

SCHEDULING: Jumper changes must be made by 4:00pm the day prior to the class. Changes made after this time may be required to work first in the order of go. Please Note: adds may not be accepted for a class scheduled on that same day. In all Classics and Special classes horses must be declared by 4:00 the day preceding the class. The order will be drawn and posted shortly thereafter. All horses declared after 4:00pm will be considered post entries and may be required to go first in the order. **A scratch fee of \$50 (\$100 for the Grand Prix) will be charged for scratched Classics or Special classes after the order has been drawn**

ORDER OF GO: Orders for the International ring will be computer drawn and rotated except Special Classes. There will be posted start times for each class and these times will be adhered to as closely as possible. Classes will end at the scheduled finish time, riders who have not shown by that time may not be allowed to show.

COMBINING: Management reserves the right to combine or cancel Special classes or Classics if there are fewer than 6 entries in any one class.

1.0/1.05M JUNIOR AND AMATEUR JUMPER RIDER RESTRICTIONS: The horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any class held above 1.15m at the same show. The rider may enter into any class for which they are eligible on a different horse. The rider may not cross enter into any class above 1.20m at the same show.

1.10/1.15M JUNIOR AND AMATEUR JUMPERS RIDER RESTRICTIONS: The horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any class above 1.25m at the same show. The rider may enter any class at the same show for which they are eligible on a different horse. Horse/Rider combination may enter only one classic if both 1.0/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m classics are offered.

COMBINING SECTIONS: 1.0/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m Jr/Am jumper sections must combine if there are less than three in either section and may combine if there are less than six in either section. If after combining within the height sections there are less than three entries they must be further combined High with Low, allowing each section to compete at their respective height.

AWARDS/PRIZE MONEY AND CHAMPIONSHIPS: Unless otherwise noted, three must compete for points to count for all USEF recognized classes. All Classes offering more than \$500 in prize money will award one ribbon/placing for every four starters with a minimum of 8 ribbons awarded; last place to be awarded a minimum of the class start fee (JP 108). All other classes to receive 8 ribbons, and prize money will be divided: 30%,25%,20%,15%,10% unless otherwise noted. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to the two horses receiving the most points in their respective sections. Championships are determined using 10,6,4,2,1½, except the **last class in each section that will be considered a BONUS CLASS and pointed 15,9,6,3,2 & 1**. Classics, Special classes, and Clear Round (Table II) classes will not count toward the Championship. Prize money awarded in each jumper section will count towards USEF HOTY Awards.

CRUELTY TO AND ABUSE OF HORSES: Per USEF GR838 Any action(s) against a horse by any person which are deemed excessive by a Federation Judge, Federation Steward, Technical Delegate, or Competition Veterinarian in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds or evidence of action(s) described above on a horse on competition grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination. Such action(s) could include but are not limited to excessive or inappropriate use of equipment, including but not limited to the whip or spurs. Evidence may include raw, bleeding, or irritated skin, or welts consistent with excessive use or inappropriate use of equipment.

ANIMAL WELFARE: We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subjected to mistreatment. At all times, while the horse is on the show grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing all rules pertaining to the welfare of the horse. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials.

CRUELTY, ABUSE, AND MISTREATMENT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED BY ANYONE AT ANY TIME AT THE COLORADO HORSE PARK.

The elimination of any team member will eliminate the whole team. The second disobedience by any team member (two total disobediences for the whole team) or a fall of a rider will eliminate the team. The team will be eliminated if, in the change over, the horse leaves the ground at the first obstacle before the forefeet of the horse of their team member have touched the ground after their final obstacle.

GRAND PRIX SPECIFICATIONS

Declarations must be made in the Horse Show office prior to the scheduled 24 hour check in.

24 hour rule - All horses competing must be presented for check-in to the Competition Steward or their designee and must remain on the grounds for the twenty-four hour period prior to the scheduled start of the class. Any horse that has been removed from the grounds for any reason without permission of competition management is ineligible to compete in the class. Competition management will determine who the person(s) responsible is (i.e. rider, trainer, etc) for removing that horse. All of the responsible person's horses will be eliminated from that class and entry fees for that class will be forfeited.

A. Horse Inspection

1. Championship horses must be stabled on the show grounds, in official horse show stabling starting no later than two hours prior to the horse inspection and remaining on the show grounds until the completion of their championship. (Minus extenuating circumstances)
2. Horses competing in the championship may not compete in any other class at the same horse show after the Official horse inspection has taken place. Exception: Official 1.0/1.05m USHJA Championship Training class.
3. All championship horses must be presented at the mandatory horse inspection by the athlete or a designated representative. The horse inspection will be held not more than 24 hours prior to the start of the First Individual Qualifying Class.
4. If the athlete is unable to attend the horse inspection, a designated representative who is 18 years of age or older may present and jog the horse.
5. Each horse must be presented with its entry number. Following the official horse inspection, the assigned back number must always accompany the horse when it is out of its stall and must be visible on the stall door otherwise.
6. Horses not accepted at the horse inspection will have the opportunity to be re-presented once prior to the First Individual Qualifying Class.
7. If a horse is not accepted at the initial horse inspection, the horse may not participate in the Championship Training session if it is held prior to the re-inspection. Horses not accepted at the re-inspection will not be allowed to compete in the championships nor may they participate in any concurrently held competition during which the championship is held on the same grounds for a period of 48 hours following the horse inspection. (GR914.3)

B. Tack/ Equipment

USEF Rules: USEF rules will govern these Championships. (JP 111). Additionally, please pay particular attention to the specifics listed below:

1. The use of Draw Reins, German Martingales, Chambons, or any other unconventional equipment are not allowed at any time during the championships, including schooling. Exception: The use of Draw Reins is permissible during awards presentations and victory gallops.
 - Boot regulations- Refer to rule JP111.5.

C. Athlete Rules and Regulations

Although an athlete is not prevented from competing on another horse during the championship, there will be no waiting during the championship classes. If an athlete is not immediately available in the order, the athlete may be scratched from that championship class.

1. **Riders' Meeting:** There will be a mandatory riders' meeting and Show Jumping Athlete Pathway Orientation presentation; time and location will be announced. The riders' meeting will not be more than 24 hours prior to the 1st qualifying class.

2. Attire:

A. First and Second Individual Qualifying rounds and Team Competition:

White breeches and zone team shirts are encouraged; shirts must be tucked into breeches. If team shirts are not available, Formal Attire is required (JP111.9a). Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted if the color matches the paddock boot.

B. Individual Final: Formal Attire is required (JP111.9a)

CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE

Day One (First Round of the Team Championship and First Individual Qualifying Class)

- A. The class will be a Two-Phase competition, Table II, Sec. 2(d). The results of this class will be decided by adding together the faults incurred over both phases and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. Whether or not a competitor has gone clear in the first phase, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the second phase course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line for the initial phase.
- B. Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course, for any reason, shall receive 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round who completed the course and received a score.
- C. Individual Classification: Faults and time from round one will be carried forward to the individual standings.
- D. **Start Order:** The order of the individuals on a team will be determined by the Chefs d'Equipe and given to the USHJA representative at the Riders' Meeting. Teams of three will start with their first rider in the second rotation.

The top three team member scores from round one will count toward the team score; the team member with the highest score (on four person teams) will be considered the "drop" score.

E. Class Awards: Ribbons will be awarded through 8th place.

Day Two (Second Round of the Team Championship/Second Individual Qualifying Class)

- A. The team championship is a two round format held over two days. Round two also serves as the Second Individual Qualifying Class for the Individual Final. The competitors will be scored under Table II.
- B. Scoring
 - i. The second round of the team championship is open only to athlete/horse combinations that have started, whether eliminated or not, in the first team / first individual qualifying round. (Day One).
 - ii. Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course for any reason shall receive a score equal to 20 faults more than that received by the highest penalized competitor who completed the course and received a score.
 - iii. The top three scores of each team from rounds one and two will count toward the team's final score.
 - iv. The winning team will be the team with the lowest combined scores from the two rounds.
 - v. Ties will be decided by the cumulative times of the top three riders of each team from Day One/First Team Round/ First Individual Qualifier. The times from the second phase of the competition will be used.
- C. Order of Go: The starting order of teams will be the reverse order of team scores from the first round (Day One). Any teams tied will go in the order of their first round drawn order. Athletes competing as individuals will compete in drawn order in the first round and first in the second round of the team competition. The second-round order for the Individual competitors will be based on reverse order of scores from the first round.
- D. Class Awards Medals and ribbons will be awarded to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze teams, along with any trophy or other prizes that management chooses to award.
- E. 60% of the overall prize money offered will be allocated to the team competition and paid to the gold medal team – 50%, silver medal team – 30% and bronze medal team– 20% and divided equally among each team's members.

Day Three (Individual Final)

- A. The competition will conclude with the individual final on the third day. It will be scored under Table II, sec. 2. The top 15 athlete/horse combinations based on the cumulative scores from the first and second individual qualifying classes, including ties for fifteenth place, are eligible to compete. Riders who were eliminated in either of the two rounds of the competition are ineligible to compete in the individual final. The list of the top 15 will be posted and distributed as soon as feasible after the team competition concludes and medals are awarded. Following this posting, if one or more of the qualified athlete/horse combinations is unable to start in the Individual Final, the combination will not be replaced.
- B. Faults will carry forward from the previous rounds and be added to any faults from the final round to determine the final placing. Ties for other than medal placings (top three) will be broken by the second phase time from round one (first individual qualifying class)
- C. Jump-Off: There will be a jump-off in case of a tie for an individual medal. If jump-off's for multiple medals are required, the jump-off for bronze will occur first
- D. Order of Go
 - i. The start order will be the reverse order of a rider's cumulative scores incurred in the first and second individual qualifying classes. In the event of equality of scores, the time of the first qualifying class will decide, with a lower placing athlete/horse combination going before a higher placing competitor.
- E. Class Awards: Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded to the top three individuals. Ribbons will be awarded to individuals 1st through 8th as well as other prizes as specified by the organizers and the USHJA. Gold, silver, and bronze medal individuals may ride for ribbons and must stay for a podium presentation.
- F. Prize money: 40% of the overall prize money offered will be paid to winning individuals as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.
- G. The individual medalists are invited to participate in the EAP Zone Training Session of their choosing. Medalists will be provided additional information by USHJA regarding this invitation.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY VIA HORSESHOWSONLINE.COM OR EQUESTRIAN CONNECT.

ENTRY CLOSING: Entries must be submitted electronically. Closing date for the Summer in the Rockies Series is May 16 for SIR Preview, SIR 1 and SIR 2, and SIR 3 and June 6 for SIR 4, SIR 5 and SIR 6. Late entries will be accepted.

STALL RESERVATIONS and ENTRIES WILL OPEN March 17, 2025: Stall reservation forms available on: <https://langershows.com/colorado/>

ENTRY PROCEDURES – ENTRIES WILL OPEN March 28, 2025

- a) For each show the Opening Date to receive entries is March 28, and will be accepted on a first come first reserved basis. Should stalls sell out a waiting list will be established. All stalls must be reserved using the stall reservation form.
- b) For your convenience and to streamline the process, **all entries must be done on HorseShowsOnline.com or through Equestrian Connect.** Paper entries will not be accepted. Entries must be completed for each week and will require only the \$100 deposit to be paid with entry submission (total due with each horse entered is \$250). No other payment is due at the time entries are submitted. The deposit is non-refundable after the closing date of entries, May 16 (SIR 1, SIR 2 and SIR 3) or June 6 (SIR 4, SIR 5, SIR 6)
- c) **Service Fee**—All horses, showing or non-showing, will be assessed a fee of \$100 per show week. This fee allows for unlimited adds and scratches (with the exception of same day adds), access to schooling areas and competition rings at designated times, defers all parking fees and medical fees **and includes Night Watch.**
- d) Please keep office visits short and limited to one representative per barn at a time. E-Bills will be sent out on Sunday morning to the Invoice Payer defined in the online entries if requested. Trainers may request PDF's of all of their customers' invoices to be sent Saturday evening for review, all changes/corrections to invoices must be made by Sunday morning.
- e) If you plan to pay your final bill with a check, please make sure the barn representative who will be picking up numbers has the signed, open check to the office when checking in and picking up your horse's number. If you plan to pay your final bill with a credit card, **make sure that your correct email address and mobile phone number are included on your entry.**
- f) When submitting your entries, the following sections of the entry form **MUST** be completely filled out: horse's name and USEF/USHJA number, owner's name and USEF/USHJA number, trainer's name and USEF/USHJA number and all riders' names and USEF/USHJA numbers, **a valid social security number assigned to the prize money payee.** Entries received without the above information may not be processed and/or may be considered late entries.
- g) **LATE ENTRIES** - Entries received after the closing date, incomplete entries and entries made at the show will pay a \$50 late fee.
- h) USEF, USHJA, ASPCA, CHJA, NMHJA, INHJA and various other organizations have specific requirements for entry and participation in certain or all classes at this competition. Proof of membership for owners, riders and trainers, USEF Pony, Junior and Small Hunter measurement cards and horse recording numbers are among the items that sanctioning organizations require. Competitors are responsible for knowledge of the requisite rules and for providing the required data. Non-member, Show Pass and other fees may be assessed if these items are not available. Competitors may be refused entry into certain classes if required information is not provided.
- i) **SHOW PASS FEES:** For those exhibitors who are not current members of the USHJA a \$30 Show Pass will be added to your entry. **Riders and Owners will only be allowed ONE USEF Show Pass per calendar year. The show pass must be paid from your USEF account on your member dashboard.** Anyone listed as a Trainer or Coach (including Parents) must be active USEF members. In addition each horse, regardless of whether the owner is a current member of the USEF or USHJA must pay a \$75 lifetime horse registration fee.
- j) **MICROCHIP VERIFICATION:** All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions.
- k) **SAFE SPORT VERIFICATION:** As of January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete SafeSport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are bound by the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies, also known as the MAAPP. This includes the SafeSport Training requirement for adult members and participants who have regular contact with minor athletes. Additionally, please be reminded about reporting obligations. Any concerns that are non-sexual in nature, please use the USEF Safe Sport Incident Reporting Form available on the USEF website. Concerns or suspicions regarding sexual misconduct must be reported to <https://safesport.isight.com/portal> and the authorities if a minor is involved. All of this information can be found in the USEF Safe Sport Policy. To find the most up to date information, see the new USEF Safe Sport web pages on the USEF website including comprehensive resources regarding USEF Safe Sport efforts. 1. ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE: Horse arrival is anytime after 10:00am on Monday. Departure is anytime before 8:00pm on Sunday. **Early arrivals and/or late departures must be arranged in advance by emailing Zach Price at zapr4@aol.com.**

2. STABLING: STABLING REQUEST FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO RESERVE STALLS:

Stabling Request Forms can be found at: www.langershows.com/colorado

Please send to: charrobson@langershows.com. Stalls are reserved on a first come first reserved basis only upon submission of the stabling request form. Stalls may not be shared or resold. Exhibitors and Trainers note: Adjustments with regard to stall charges will not be considered after noon Friday of each show week. First bedding is not included. Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls. Stall fees are not refundable after entry closing date unless all stalls are fully sold and the cancelled stall can be re-sold by show management to another competitor based on the show's waiting list. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges. Private transactions involving stalls are not permitted. Whether occupied by horses, feed or tack stall fees remain the same:

ClearSpan stalls are 12'x12' and are \$450 – (\$300 for Young Jumpers or Young Hunters)

Permanent stalls are 10' x 12' and are \$450 – (\$325 for Young Jumpers or Young Hunters)

Young Jumpers and Young Hunters showing only in the Young Jumper or Young Hunter classes will receive a discount on stall fees. Permanent and Clear Span stalls all have dirt flooring. Doors are provided for all stalls.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

2a. PADDOCKS: Turnout paddocks are available on a first-reserved basis, Tuesday morning to Sunday evening, for \$300 per week. Paddocks are steel pipe, dimensions approximately 24' x 24'. Lock and chain are not provided for paddocks. Horses found in paddocks which have not been reserved and paid for will be identified and the weekly paddock charge will be added to the owners account.

2b. STABLE AREA: Between the hours of 9:00pm and 7:00am music may not be played in the stable area. At all other times the noise level may not exceed 75 decibels for more than three consecutive minutes. Smoking is not allowed anywhere in the stable area. Aisle ways may not be blocked at any time.

3. GROUNDS FEE: This fee is charged to entries that do not reserve stalls. **he Grounds fee is \$50 per day with a maximum per week of \$150** and will be charged to all entries who compete without reserving a stall and who trailer in to compete, Entries boarded at adjacent properties and competing without reserving a stall will be assessed a one time per week fee of \$50. Hunter Breeding horses are exempt from paying any Grounds Fees.

4. FULL TIME BOARDERS: If showing, CHP contracted boarders will be charged a one time per week fee of \$50. Boarders of the Colorado Horse Park wishing to ride on the show grounds during the show without competing, must register each horse as a Non-Showing Horse. Failure to do so may result in charges being filed with USEF.

5. NON-SHOWING HORSES: Any horse on the grounds but not competing must be registered as a Non-Showing Horse. This includes completing and signing an entry blank, along with paying the requisite fee(s). Non-showing horses must pay the service fee of \$75, a stall fee or grounds fee (as appropriate), a non-showing fee of \$150 and the drug fee. Full time boarded horses at CHP pay a reduced fee of \$50 plus the drug fee. Non-showing horses are allowed in any horse show arenas that are open for schooling and/or warm up, as well as access to other horse show facilities. All non-showing horses will be assigned a number.

6. FEED AND BEDDING: Feed and bedding are available for purchase during the horse show. If you want a delivery available upon your arrival, please make sure to complete the **Pre-Show Feed and Bedding order form** which can be found at www.langershows.com/colorado, and submit to feedCO@langershows.com. Please note all deadlines and provide all required information in order to ensure your delivery. Same day hay and shavings orders are available through Saturday of each show providing that orders are placed with the show office by 11:00 am. Grain and Specialty item orders may need up to 48 hours for delivery.

Exhibitors may bring their own feed/shavings however deliveries from outside feed companies will not be allowed.

7. PAYMENT METHODS: The horse show accepts cash, money order, checks drawn on an American bank and credit cards. Credit Cards accepted are VISA, Mastercard, Discover and American Express. **Credit Cards will be charged a 3% convenience fee. Convenience fee is not charged on the \$150 entry deposit.**

7a. UNPAID ACCOUNTS: All accounts not settled by 5:00pm on the last day of competition of the competition week will be closed out by the show secretary using the payment information provided. All persons issuing returned checks and/or declined credit cards will have ten days to settle their account, with cash or cash equivalent (including penalty) or will be turned over to USEF for disciplinary action. Accounts not closed out by Tuesday following each show may be assessed a penalty of \$75.

8. ENTRY NUMBERS: Horse entry numbers will not be released without form of payment and having all necessary paperwork completed. All horses on the grounds will be assigned a number, including non-showing horses. ***In the effort to keep all our horses safe and healthy entry numbers must accompany horses at all times when not in their assigned stabling area. The show number must be attached to the horse or the individual riding, lunging or handling.***

9. NON-NEGOTIABLE FUNDS: All returned checks and declined credit cards will be charged a 10% penalty (\$50 minimum). Account holders will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash, cash equivalent or credit card. After 10 days without payment the horse show will notify USEF and other sanctioning organizations for disciplinary action.

10. USEF RULE GR901.11: The horse show policies stated herein regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of USEF Rule GR901.11.

11. MINOR EXHIBITORS: No minor's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian.

12. SPECIAL CLASSES: See Special Class information in Division Specifications for adding, scratching, and minimum entry requirements.

13. ADDING REGULAR CLASSES: There is no additional (post entry) fee to add regular classes. **Adds must be done by 4:00pm the day preceding the class.** Same day adds may not be accepted, if same day adds are allowed there will be a \$10 per class late fee and all same day adds must be made in the horse show office. Adds and Scratches should be made using horseshowsonline.com (mobile.horseshowsonline.com). If you have any trouble please don't hesitate to come by the horse show office for technical support, we are here to help you!

14. SCRATCHING REGULAR CLASSES: Classes (with the exception of classics and special classes) scratched prior to the start of the class will receive full credit. We strongly encourage all scratches to be handled online through horseshowsonline.com.

15. SHOW SCRATCH: A "Show Scratch" is applied to any horse entered in the show that does not show in any classes and is not registered as a "Non-showing Horse." In order to be eligible for a refund, Show Scratches must be submitted in writing (email okay) by the deadlines described herein. Show Scratches submitted before the official closing date for the show entered will receive a full refund of the stall fee, the service fee, the deposit, and any other fees paid. Show Scratches submitted after the closing date and before the start of the show will receive a refund of the service fee and a refund of the stall fee only if the stall can be re-sold by the show. The entry deposit will only be refunded after closing date in extraordinary circumstances. Show Scratches submitted after the show begins will not receive a refund.

16. SUBSTITUTIONS: Under the same ownership, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse as long as the scratched horse has not shown in any classes. The scratched horse's Service Fee and stall fee are transferred to the substituted horse with no penalty. **The scratched horse will pay only the \$150 deposit. Deposits are not transferable.**

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

17. CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters in order to reduce delays. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely. Trainer conflicts are not considered legitimate conflicts.

18. MINIMUM ENTRIES: Medal classes that do not have enough entries to fill by 4:00 pm the night preceding the class will be combined if possible, and otherwise cancelled. For regular classes, a minimum of three entries to fill. For Special Classes—see section on Special classes.

19. RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter): Entries that show in a class that are not properly entered will be charged the class entry fee plus a \$50.00 RDNE Fee.

20. JUMPER NOMINATING FEE: All horses entered in classes at 1.20m and above that pay prize money are required to pay the nominating fee of \$150. Once a horse is nominated it is entitled to enter any jumper class for which it is eligible. **Horses entered only in Young Jumper classes are exempt from paying the nominating fee.**

21. PRIZE MONEY: Prize money checks will be mailed to the listed payee within 30 days of the conclusion of the show. **Tax ID of PAYEE is required before any prize money will be sent.** Exhibitors are responsible for listing the correct payee information. Please confirm with the show secretary that the prize money payee is correct.

22. ADD BACK MONEY: In classes with add back, total prize money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses that are entered but do not compete will forfeit the add back.

23. SCHOOLING: Schooling will be permitted in designated areas only. The word schooling includes, but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading, and exercising. Poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted anywhere at the Colorado Horse Park. Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for fines and/or elimination. Ticketed schooling may be held in the Main Hunter Ring and Hunter Ring 2 Tuesday of each week. At management's discretion and weather permitting hunter rings will be open for schooling for a limited amount of time at the conclusion of each show day. Hunter Rings will be open from 6:00am to 7:00am each day for hacking only. **The International ring will be open for schooling until 3:00pm on the Tuesday prior to the start of the show each week, weather permitting.**

24. LUNGING: Horses may be lunged in the designated lunging areas only. The correct and current show entry number must be attached to the horse or the individual lunging.

25. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters have authority as agents of management to enforce USEF schooling rules.

26. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Per USEF GR801.2 All persons are required to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag while mounted anywhere on the competition grounds. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition.

SAFETY VESTS: Per GR801.4 Any exhibitor may wear a protective vest either body protecting or inflatable, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge. The Federation recommends that the vest pass or surpass the current ASTM standard F1937 or be certified by the Safety Equipment Institute.

27. DAMAGE / HOLES IN STALLS & BARN WALLS: Damage to stalls (permanent or portable) will be billed to the account of the owner of the horse occupying the stall, or in the case of tack stalls to the trainer assigned the stalls. All stalls will be checked by the barn manager prior to move in of the horses. Please note any prior damage to stalls to the barn manager immediately upon occupancy to avoid any incorrect charges.

28. ARENAS: All warm up and competition arenas contain Geotextile footing. Approximate size of arenas: **International Ring**—200' x 380'; **Coors Arena**—150' x 275'; **Olson Family Arena**—150' x 300'; **Coles Arena**—150' x 300'; **Ring 6**—140' x 275'; **Ring 7**—140' x 275'. All warm-up arenas are approximately 120' x 225' and have Geotextile footing.

29. MOTORIZED VEHICLES / GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

30. PERSONAL ELECTRONIC TRANSPORT DEVICES: GR1301.8 The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials at management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

31. DOGS: All dogs must be on leashes or otherwise contained, this includes Bull Dogs. Owners of loose dogs will be subject to a fine of up to \$100 and the issuance of a USEF Official Warning Card.

32. DESIGNATED PARKING: All vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. Improperly parked vehicles are subject to tow at the owner's expense. Parking in the stable area is a safety hazard and not allowed except for immediate loading and unloading. Disabled parking area passes are always available in the horse show office.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

33. MEDICAL WASTE: Sharps must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a \$100 fine per occurrence.

34. VACCINATIONS and HEALTH CERTIFICATES:

- a. Per USEF GR844 Equine Vaccination Rule:** At Federation licensed competitions, horses more than 7 months of age entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horse not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.
- b. Statement of Health/Veterinary Health Certificate:** A health certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of arrival at CHP is required. Please see Horse Health Information on pg 6 for all required information. To facilitate a quick and easy entry to the horse park we highly recommend that you submit the required health certificates prior to travel. **Health certificates can be submitted for pre-check to: horsehealth@langershows.com**

35. RV PARKING: : RV spaces with water and electric are available but limited. Please complete and submit the official RV reservation form in the prize list and on the LEG website to—coloradohorseparkrv@gmail.com. Spaces are provided on a first reserved basis. Spaces are available for \$400 per show week (Monday-Sunday) with water and 30 or 50 amp electric. One pump-out per week is included. The pump-truck must have clear access to the unit in order to pump it. Units blocked by vehicles, or units with irregular hook-ups or locked compartments will not be serviced. Self-contained RVs without hook-ups will be charged \$150 per show and must park where management designates.

36. PONY, JUNIOR & SMALL HUNTER MEASUREMENT: All Ponies, Junior and Small Hunters are required to possess a current USEF Measurement Card or valid measurement form and it must be shown at the horse show office before numbers are released. Measurements can be scheduled throughout the show by signing up in the horse show office.

37. UNETHICAL TREATMENT OF THE HORSE: Per USEF GR838 Any Participant engaging in the Unethical Treatment of a Covered Horse is subject to penalty. Except in exigent circumstances, the Unethical treatment of a Covered Horse is defined as any action or inaction that may negatively compromise the Covered Horse's Health, safety, or well-being. It may include any action(s) or inaction(s) that causes or is likely to cause a horse pain, a state of obvious distress, or unnecessary discomfort. **CRUELTY AND ABUSE WILL NOT BE TOLERATED BY ANYONE AT ANY TIME AT THE COLORADO HORSE PARK.**

38. ANIMAL WELFARE: We require that all horse be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subjected to mistreatment. At all times, while the horse is on the show grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing all rules pertaining to the welfare of the horse. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers organizers, sponsors or officials.

IN THE EVENT OF AN ACUTE AND SERIOUS INJURY TO OR ILLNESS OF A HORSE ON COMPETITION GROUNDS WHEN THE OWNER OR PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE HORSE (TRAINER OF THE HORSE OR AGENT OF THE OWNER) IS NOT PRESENT, AFTER REASONABLE EFFORT TO CONTACT THAT INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN MADE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH A LICENSED VETERINARIAN, MAY AUTHORIZE THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY VETERINARY TREATMENT OF THE HORSE. IF COMPETITION MANAGEMENT SO AUTHORIZES TREATMENT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE RULE, COMPETITION MANAGEMENT AND VETERINARIAN ARE NOT LIABLE FOR ANY RESULTING COSTS, DAMAGES, LOSSES, CLAIM OR ACTIONS ARISING DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FROM THE TREATMENT OF THE HORSE.

39. MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions with regard to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, alter any course, cancel, combine, or re-schedule classes, change rings, substitute judges, change specifications in jumper classes, etc. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by Management whose decision will be final.

40. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Please be advised that alcoholic beverages in any form may not be brought onto the grounds of the Colorado Horse Park.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies. State rules may prohibit entry of ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. State rules may prohibit entry of ponies.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections. **Cross Entry:** **Riders:** Adult Amateur Hunter riders may not cross enter into any hunter class with fences exceeding 3'6" nor any jumper class with fences exceeding 1.20m (3'11") at the same show. In the under saddle class the cross entry restrictions do not apply, but an Adult Amateur must ride in the Adult Amateur Hunter under saddle. **Horses:** Horses may cross enter into any other classes or sections where eligible. **Horse and Rider Combination:** The horse-and-rider combination is restricted from showing in both Amateur Owner and Adult Amateur Hunter sections at the same show. The same horse and rider combination competing in the Adult Amateur Hunter may not cross enter into a USHJA International Hunter Derby. **Fence Height:** 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height. Courses will not be adjusted for ponies. In and outs will be permitted. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** May be split into three (3) sections: Adult Amateurs 18 – 35; Adult Amateurs 36–49; Adult Amateurs 50 & Over. At Premier rated competitions, the Adult Amateur Hunter section must be offered divided by age as follows: Adult Amateur 18- 35, Adult Amateur 36- 49 Adult Amateur 50 & over. At Premier rated competitions, the Adult Amateur Hunter section must be offered divided by age as follows: Adult Amateur 18- 35, Adult Amateur 36- 49 Adult Amateur 50 & over. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in any age group, that group must be combined with another. In the event that after combining all three age groups, there are still fewer than three (3) entries; management must combine the Adult Amateur Hunter section with the Children's Hunter Horse section. National and Regional rated competitions are not required to offer the section divided, but may do so at management's discretion. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Adult Amateur Hunter 18– 35, Adult Amateur 36– 49, Adult Amateurs 50 & Over.

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry:** **Riders:** Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 1.10m or 3'6". **Horses:** No cross entry restrictions. **Horse and Rider Combination:** Horse and Rider combinations may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9" (Exception: 3'0" Equitation). **Fence Height:** 2'6" **Combining/Dividing Sections:** The Low Adult Amateur Hunter and Low Children's Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Adult Amateur Hunter.

ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER Sections offered and requirements: 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper. 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper. **Cross Entry:** **Rider:** The 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper rider may cross enter into any class at the same competition for which they are eligible on different horse. A 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper rider may not cross enter in classes above 1.25m at the same competition. The 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper rider may cross enter into any class at the same competition for which they are eligible on different horse. If after combining the 1.00/1.05m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.00/1.05m sections with the 1.10/1.15m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. 1.10/1.15m Junior and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. If after combining the 1.10/1.15m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.10/1.15m sections with the 1.00/1.05m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. If sections are combined a horse can only compete at one height. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper; 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper.

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: ADULT SECTION Sections Offered: Adult Equitation 18-35. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either age group, the two groups must be combined. In the event that, after combining the two age groups, there are still fewer than three (3) entries; management must combine the Children's Hunter Horse section with the Adult Amateur Hunter section. National and Regional rated competitions are not required to offer the section divided, but may do so at management's discretion. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under; Children's Hunter Horse 15-17.

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 1.10m or 3'6". **Horses:** No cross entry restrictions. **Horse and Rider Combination:** Horse and Rider combinations may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9" (Exception: 3'0" Equitation). **Fence Height:** 2'6" **Combining/Dividing Sections:** The Low Children's Hunter and Low Adult Amateur Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Children's Hunter Horse.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY Sections offered and requirements: Small/Medium Children's Pony; Large Children's Pony. **Cross Entry: Rider:** No cross entry restrictions. **Horse/Pony:** The pony is restricted from cross entering between the Regular Pony Hunter, Green Pony Hunter and Children's Hunter Pony sections at the same horse show. **Horse and Rider Combination:** The pony-and-rider combination is restricted from showing in both Regular Pony Hunter, Green Pony Hunter and Children's Hunter Pony at the same horse show. **Fence Height:** Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0" with spreads not to exceed height of fence. Large Ponies: 2'6" with spreads not to exceed height of fence. In and outs will not be permitted. The spread of any oxer must be measured including flowers, brush and ground lines. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** The Children's Hunter Pony section must be offered and run by itself and may not be combined with the Children's Hunter Horse or any other section at Premier and National rated competitions. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Children's Hunter Pony section at any Regional rated competition, it may be combined with the Children's Hunter Horse section. In this case, in-and-outs are prohibited. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Pony-Small/Medium; Children's Hunter Pony-Large.

JUNIOR JUMPER Sections offered and Requirements: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper, 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper. **Cross Entry: Rider:** The 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper rider may cross enter into any class at the same competition for which they are eligible on different horse. A 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper rider may not cross enter in classes above 1.25m at the same competition. The 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper rider may cross enter into any class at the same competition for which they are eligible on different horse. If a 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper classic is offered in the Junior's or Amateur Jumpers and the rider has jumped above 1.25m at that show then they are not eligible for any Classic in the Junior's/Amateur Jumper sections. **Horse/Pony:** No cross entry restrictions. **Horse and Rider Combination:** The same 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any class held above 1.15m at the same competition. Horse/Rider combination may enter only one classic, if both 1.00/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m classics are offered. The same 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any class held above 1.25m at the same competition. Horse/Rider combination may enter only one classic, if both 1.00/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m classics are offered. **Fence Height:** Junior Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m; Junior Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** 1.00/1.05m Junior and 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than 3 in either section and may combine if there are fewer than 6 in either section. If after combining the 1.00/1.05m sections there are fewer than 3 entries then competition management must further combine the 1.00/1.05m sections with the 1.10/1.15m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. If sections are combined a horse can only compete at one height. 1.10/1.15m Junior and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than 3 in either section and may combine if there are fewer than 6 in either section. If after combining the 1.10/1.15m sections there are fewer than 3 entries then competition management must further combine the 1.10/1.15m sections with the 1.00/1.05m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. If sections are combined a horse can only compete at one height. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper; 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper.

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: CHILDREN'S/JUNIOR SECTION Sections offered: Equitation 11 & Under; Equitation 12-14; Equitation 15-17. **Cross Entry:** No cross entry restrictions. **Fence Height:** Equitation 11 & Under - 2'3"- 2'6" with spreads not to exceed fence height. Combinations are prohibited. Equitation 12-14 - 3'0- 3'3" with spreads not to exceed fence height. Combinations are optional. Equitation 15-17 - 3'0"- 3'3" with spreads not to exceed fence height. Combinations are optional. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** Equitation 11 & Under: Age group sections may be combined to meet the three (3) entry minimum requirement for points to be awarded. If 11 & Under and 12-14, or all three age groups combined, each age group section must jump their respective height; combinations are prohibited. Equitation 12-14: Age group section may be combined to meet the three (3) entry minimum requirement for points to be awarded. If the 12-14 and 15-17 are combined each age group section must jump their respective height; combinations are optional. Equitation 15- 17: Age group section may be combined to meet the three (3) entry minimum requirement for points to be awarded. If the 12-14 and 15-17 are combined each age group section must jump their respective height; combinations are optional. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Equitation 11 & Under; Equitation 12- 14; Equitation 15- 17.

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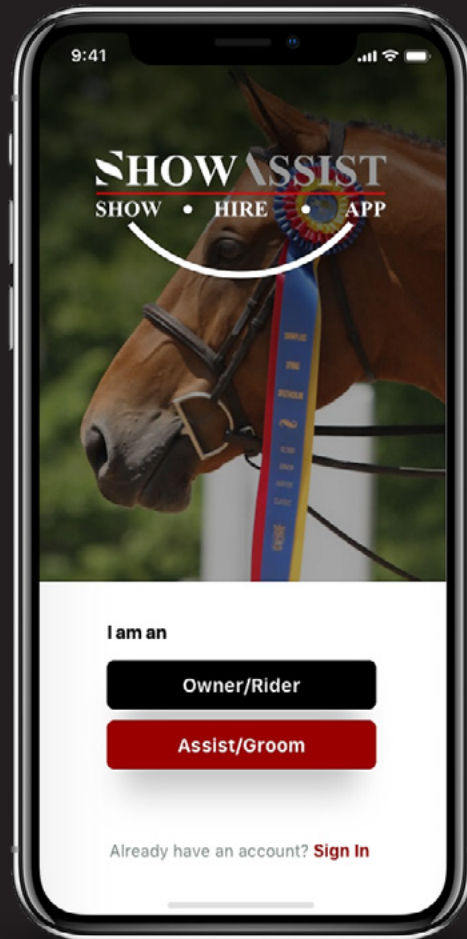
